Langley School is an HMC boarding and day school offering an all through education to more than 800 pupils aged two to 18.


- Langley Prep School, Taverham (ages 2 to 13)

About the role

Structure



Aim to give pupils a good general understanding of the topics covered and to encourage enjoyment of the subject and an understanding of scientific method, through practical and active learning.



From Year 9 onwards, pupils are taught by subject specialists. In Year 9 and 10, pupils have three sixty-minute lessons of each subject per fortnight and in Year 11 they have five sixty-minute lessons of each subject per fortnight.



At Key Stage 4, the AQA trilogy and triple Science syllabi are followed by the pupils. High achieving pupils are encouraged to use an option to study triple award and follow the separate Biology, Chemistry and Physics GCSE courses.



We have ambitious value-added targets (+1 CAT) and at AS and A2 level, we follow the OCR 'A' Physics course. Courses are practical and aim to develop the skills required to continue study of the subjects at University or for entry onto courses that require these A levels such as medicine and engineering.



The School also offers a daily program of sports and activities to which all staff are expected to contribute, according to their interests and expertise. Science based activities would be welcome as an extension to those gifted in this respect.

Purpose and job specification

- Ensure that all lessons are planned with clear aims and objectives, and delivered in line with the departmental schemes of work and school policies.
- Plan and deliver dynamic and engaging learning experiences and provide meaningful feedback that supports pupils' next steps.
- Take into account the differing ability lessons of pupils and differentiate work accordingly.
- Participate in public and internal examination arrangements together with any other review or assessment programmes and to report on these in accordance with published schedules.
- Encourage all pupils to be actively engaged in their own learning and in reviewing their progress against targets.
- Check that all subject matter is effectively communicated and understood by all groups of pupils.
- Keep careful records of student progress in line with departmental and school policy.
