



Dear Parents/Carers,

You will undoubtedly be aware from media coverage that the Covid-19 vaccination program is being rolled out to 12-15 year olds from week beginning 27th September, with schools acting as host vaccination centres for the Community School Aged Immunisation Service.

We are awaiting further information in respect of the consent procedure, but in the meantime we can advise dates for each site have been confirmed as follows;

Langley Prep – Monday 8th November, for those pupil who attend Langley Prep aged 12-15 on 8th November, whose parent or carer has consented to being vaccinated.

Langley Senior – Friday 12th November, for those pupils who attend Senior site, aged 12-15 on 12th November, whose parent or carer has consented to being vaccinated.

Please be reassured that you will receive information on how to consent in plenty of time, in the meantime we have signposted some useful links, as follows;
