Boarding Principles

We aim to create a secure and happy environment in an atmosphere which is relaxed yet purposeful. Our purpose is to create conditions in which the needs of the individual are recognised. We encourage pupils and students to take increasing responsibility for themselves and as they become older, to take responsibility for others too. We aim to create a community in which people are treated with respect, sensitivity and consideration.

The Boarding Environment

The boarding community is a vital part of Langley. You will make friends for life, with the time and space to grow together, as well as the independence to make and grasp all types of opportunities.

Throughout the School, we celebrate the individual and it is no different in boarding, where every individual's needs, passions and interests are supported.

On Arrival

Before you arrive, we receive any academic and social information from your previous school, parents, guardians and yourselves. We consider room allocations with these factors in mind.

When you arrive, you will be greeted by one of our Houseparents and shown to your room, taken on a tour of the School and allocated a 'buddy.'

Everyone will participate in our welcome activitities for the first two weeks of term. It is a great opportunity to get to know each other and what we have to offer here at Langley. We will also go on two trips during this time with everyone in the boarding house.

Boarding life is communal so we encourage English to be used in all social areas, but the EAL (English as an Additional Language) department will conduct linguistic assessments early on and will support you throughout.

There will be a review after three weeks, looking at academic and boarding aspects, which may lead to direct communication with your parents/carer, including an invitation for either or both to visit you here.

What to Bring


We ask that you limit your clothes luggage to fit into one suitcase and a holdall. If you need us to order a duvet and pillows, **please give us as much notice as possible**.

Start of Term



What happens at the start and end of term?

Your parents should arrange your travel, flight bookings, passport and visa requirements, and renewal of travel documents. We publish term and holiday dates a year in advance and we ask that flights are not arranged before the end of term. We also ask that departures/arrivals are not arranged between 11.00pm and 6.00am. We can help to arrange airport transfers where needed. Special permission must be sought from the Headmaster (letter or email to the Headmaster's PA) in advance of any travel during term time. Due to Visa regulations this is of particular importance to those students on a Tier 4 Visa.

What happens during half term?

Pupils are expected to return home or stay with their guardian during School holidays. Where there is sufficient demand, we may be able to remain open during half term.

Leisure Time

The boarding experience features a variety of 'Leave' options, and an extensive programme of both indoor and outdoor activities on weekday evenings, as well as evening and weekend trips.

Visits range from regular cinema visits to an excellent Arts programme with trips to theatres, exhibitions, shows and recitals.

We actively encourage our overseas boarders to explain and show something of their cultural background; for example, the celebration of Chinese New Year. Whatever your religious observations, each House attends an afternoon reflection once a week.

Activities and Trips

Each week a list of upcoming activities is published. Please check the noticeboards to see what's going on.

If you have any ideas, please share them with the Houseparents. To help with administration, please sign up for trips at the start of term.

Weekend Leave

We would like to know your arrangements for weekends on a Thursday. You will need to fill in a form during our house meeting time to confirm what your plans are that weekend. You must have appropriate permissions in place from parents and guardians to leave the site, without these, you may be refused that permission. The weekend arrangment form will be available for you from a Monday evening to complete.

Weekend Loddon Leave

Loddon is a small, picturesque village with a selection of speciality shops and a waterside picnic area, which you can visit on Saturdays between 11.00am and 5.00pm (or dusk, whichever is the earliest) or on a Sunday after brunch.

Weekend Norwich Leave

Norwich is our closest city, approximately 10 miles away, filled with hidden gems and winding alleyways, incredible heritage sites, modern technology and compelling architecture spanning 1000 years. Great for shopping and socialising, Norwich boasts independent and high street shops, cinemas, theatres and restaurants. 'Norwich Leave' is available on Saturday and Sunday, it's frequency is restricted by your age, events, behaviour during the week, academic progress and safety issues. Younger pupils must be accompanied. There is also a weekly trip to a supermarket on a weekday evening.

Pocket Money

Your parents can transfer money to the school account. You can draw that money out as you need it dependant on your age. Alternatively, we can help you to open a local bank account.

Pastoral Support

We care about every single member of our boarding family, and we will be fully sensitive to your feelings, but it's not always easy to know that you need to talk, so you may have to take the first step. Here's who you can talk to:

- Subject Teachers your first point of call, speak to or email them anytime
- **Form Tutor** these teachers have a special responsibility for helping you, and can advise and support you if you have a particular issue
- **Learning Support** if you feel that you would benefit from this support, and it hasn't been pre-arranged, please speak to the boarding team
- English as an Additional Language the EAL department supports overseas boarders throughout their time at Langley
- **Boarding Staff** always in houses at evenings and weekends. Never be afraid to ask for help, as staff will know you well and will always assist
- Heads of Year you will have a Head of Year, who will be able to assist, however big or small the issue
- **Nursing Staff** kind and understanding, Nurses take time to develop a good relationship with you, to cater for your health and wellbeing needs
- Prefects you will have a House Captain and House Prefects who you can approach at any time if you need support
- Guardians you must be appointed one if your parents live outside the UK, and Guardian details must be shared with us

We also have a Concerns and Suggestions Box in the Main House, which you are actively encouraged to use. We host daily boarding community meetings in which you can raise and discuss any issues at all.

If you feel that there isn't anyone in the School who can help with your problem, there are people outside the school who have offered to be available to any pupil or student who needs their help.

Academic Support

Half termly, parents/carers will receive progress and effort grades, which are supplemented by termly full reports and annual parents' evening. There is also frequent correspondence between the academic and boarding staff to ensure that you are working to the best of your ability.

It is your responsibility to check for homework, to spread tasks evenly – considering deadlines – and record what you have done. Homework sessions are the minimum that we expect you to do. Years 6 to 10 have supervised homework sessions, while Year 11 and Sixth Form may study in their rooms.

Medical Care

The local GP, Dr Morgan, holds a clinic in the Medical Centre every Friday morning and full boarders will be registered with Chet Valley Health Centre in Loddon.

Medication

Due to prescribing restrictions in schools, it is necessary for all medication, prescribed or non-prescriptive (although it is not necessary to bring any with you as we supply) to be handed to the School Nurse, including clear labelling with your name, dose and usage/timings.

The Boarding House contains a secure safe for medication. Boarding staff follow the set procedure for administering and recording medication. This procedure is outlined in the Medication Book.

Asthmatics are encouraged to carry an inhaler at all times, providing us with a spare inhaler.

If you have serious allergies requiring an EpiPen please carry one at all times and, again, provide a second EpiPen to be stored in the Medical Centre or boarding house for your use only.

All medication administered in School by boarding staff must be recorded in the medical register.

Expectations and Behaviour

- Speak to people with respect and good manners
- Be truthful and live honestly
- Listen to each other
- Do your best and try hard
- · Take pride in what you do
- Aspire to reach your potential
- Be positive and get involved
- Attend all of your lessons punctually
- Attend all homework sessions and complete set work

Rewards and Sancations

At all times the School's Behaviour Policy is applicable to boarding and will be followed. However, there are extra specific rewards and sanctions that can be issued, which will be appropriate to the situation.

Specific Boarding Rewards

- Allowed to have a take away
- Celebratory meals out
- Reward trips
- Treat of your choice
- Late leave

Specific Boarding Sanctions

- Removal of internet and/or device
- Boarding detention
- Grounding
- Banned from trips
- Boarding suspension
- Duties around the house



Boarding House Duty

Within your bedroom/dorm, it is important that you:

- Put away and hang clothes when not in use
- Place dirty laundry in appropriate basket and take to the laundry before breakfast
- Keep floors clear of debris and put rubbish in bins
- Neatly stack desktops and shelves
- Make your bed
- Switch off lights and electrical equipment when not in use

The maintenance team conduct checks via tours of the accommodation, accompanied by senior boarding staff. You are encouraged to report matters requiring repair or attention.

Laundry

You can get your clothes laundered as per the schedule below.

- You should take your laundry basket down when you go to breakfast
- Collect at the end of the school day
- Saturday laundry should be left outside laundry on Friday evening, or delivered by 8:15am on Saturday morning
- You must make sure that you name all your clothing. Make sure your socks and underwear is put in a sock bag, placing it inside your basket

Take your items down daily to the laundry before breakfast – little and often is the motto. Clearly label all clothing with woven name tags or indelible pen. For staff to sew on labels there will be a charge of 50p per tag. The school cannot be responsible for unmarked articles. All items must be machine washable and suitable for tumble dryers. You will be told on your induction about bedding washing days.

Safety

Safeguarding

A dedicated team of residential staff are in the Boarding Houses at all times. Further to all residential staff being first aid trained one of the senior staff is a trained safeguarding lead.

Registration

On all leave you must:

- · Wear appropriate clothing for the weather conditions
- If below Year 9, only go in groups or with a Sixth Form student
- Not attempt to 'thumb' lifts or accept lifts from anyone
- Walk on designated footpaths/pavements. If you have to use the road or where paths are narrow, walk in single file, face the oncoming traffic, keep as close to the verge as possible and stay alert
- Be back in School before it is dark (house staff will advise)
- Keep some coins or a mobile phone should you need to contact the school
- Remember that the laws of the land and local by-laws apply to you and must be observed
- Represent the School and display high standards of behaviour
- Be safe and sensible
- Travel safely and be aware of travel times
- Plan out a safe way to return (there are no public bus stops next to the School)
- Take enough money to cover your return fare
- If you need transport booking, this must be requested on your weekend arrangement form





For your own safety it's really important that we know when you are in and when you are out of the house. Therefore, you must sign in and out of the Boarding House as you leave and when you return. This must be done with the member of staff on duty. Members of the public cannot enter the Boarding House without signing in with a member of staff, please be aware of this when there are outside events onsite.

For senior students and those with positions of responsibility within the boarding community, evening leave is granted with permission and or earned by positive, responsible behaviour and application. Signing in and out is vital.

Fire Safety

There is a rigorous fire safety policy. All rooms have fire alarms, which are tested regularly.

There are multiple fire alarm buttons and fire extinguishers in the Boarding Houses. Regular fire drills are carried out and detailed instructions are available in the boarding houses.

In the case of a fire, a continuous, pulsing bleeper will sound the alarm. You must leave as quickly and calmly as possible and assemble at the correct point of roll call.

Our safety regulations:

- Matches and lighters are not allowed
- Nothing should be placed over bedside lights or touching overhead lights
- Self-closing doors should not be propped open
- Electric blankets and heaters are not allowed
- Kettles or toasters in rooms are forbidden



Electrical Equipment

When you join us and fill in your induction form, please list any electric equipment you have that plugs into the mains. During the Michaelmas Term independent PAT testing occurs. If you purchase any other devices during the School year, please also inform boarding staff so we can update our records.

While speakers are allowed in rooms, do not use them during study time. Personal games consoles are only allowed in the Sixth Form accomodation, with written permission from senior staff. All electrical equipment and plugs should be labelled with a kite mark or CE mark as standard – electrical safety is important, and staff will intervene and remove equipment that poses a threat to safety.

Phones and Valuables

Boarders of under the age of 16 hand their devices in at bedtime every night and received them back the next morning. They are signed in, stored securely and (whenever possible) charged overnight.

Boarders of aged 16 and over hand their devices in at bedtime Sunday to Thursday inclusive, but (with parental permission) may be allowed to keep their device over the weekend.

Sixth Form boarders are allowed to keep their devices overnight only with parental permission.

You will be provided with a lockable facility, and doors on dormitories are also secured throughout the day. All passports and visas should be handed to Houseparents, to keep safe. We advise against using passports as photographic proof of identity, due to problems with obtaining replacements in case of loss.

In terms of pocket money, we encourage you to run your own private accounts, unless your parents have requested a monitoring on spending.

Cooking Equipment

There should be no cooking equipment in boarding rooms, this includes kettles. We have a brand new kitchen downstairs. You must be considerate when using these communal areas, ensuring you clean and tidy up after you use it. No food is allowed in the bedrooms and must be kept downstairs in the lockable cupboard within the kitchen.

Alcohol, Vapes, Tobacco, Drugs

You are not allowed to buy or use alcohol, drugs, tobacco or vapes while at Langley School. You will face serious sanctions if you do.

'The only exception is that Sixth Form boarders may have a small amount of alcohol with parents permission. If boarding staff feel that your alcohol consumption is at a level of concern, we reserve the right to breathalyse you, using a standard approved unit purchased from Boots the chemist called 'AlcoSense.' We use the current UK driving regulations to ascertain if you are over the blood alcohol limit.

The School reserves the right to drug test if we have reason to believe you have taken illegal substances. Further information regarding these matters can be found on the school website under policies.

Email and Wi-Fi

You will be given a School email address and you can use School computers or your device to check your School email account regularly.

Monday to Friday morning, the School Wi-Fi is on between 6.30am and 8.00am and from 5.30pm. Wi-Fi switches off overnight at a time appropriate



Visitors

Visitors are not permitted upstairs without Houseparent permission.

Complaints

We encourage you to speak with staff if you have any informal concerns, so that these can be resolved. If however you decide to make a formal complaint, this will be written down and passed to Senior staff, Deputy Heads, David Stanbridge (Boarding Governor) and/or the Headmaster. At any stage, you can communicate with your parents/carer and they might wish to support you and or become involved in the process.
